In 2024, the Mirastar Community Impact Fund helped direct over \$205,000 to nonprofit organizations across Santa Clara and San Benito counties. These funds supported diverse initiatives, from providing backpacks for students in need to funding food distribution programs that make sure all families have access to nutritious meals. We also supported organizations who promote specialized areas of community health, resilience, and well-being, so that our resources reach those who need it most.

Children & Education

Mirastar cares deeply about the learning experiences of students across our region, and takes an active role in fostering literacy, preparing young people for meaningful careers, and making sure teachers have essential classroom resources. We especially champion programs that inspire curiosity, environmental stewardship, STEAM, and the practical, hands-on trades needed in our communities.

Santa Clara County Office of Education Grant

One of our most impactful contributions was our donation of \$20,000 to the SCCOE in support of the following programs that serve, motivate, and expand student and public-school access:

Environmental Literacy Summit

This event brings together educators, students, community partners, and environmental advocates to explore innovative strategies in environmental education, climate resiliency, and sustainability. This year's theme was "Pathways to a Sustainable Future: Learning, Leading, and Living for Change," featuring workshops, panels, and keynote speakers.

Childcare Provider Recognition Day

The "Early Care & Education Childcare Provider Recognition Day and Educational Forum" celebrates the essential role that childcare plays in our community and connects providers with local leaders to raise awareness around the need for accessible, quality childcare for everyone.

Youth Health and Wellness Summit

The summit invites staff, teachers, and health partners to gather in the spirit of enhancing the overall wellbeing of students and their families. They analyze the connection between physical health and mental wellness, and together develop strategies for promoting holistic wellness and positive learning outcomes.

Opportunity Youth Academy

Opportunity Youth Academy (OYA) strives to break the cycle of poverty by providing high school students who have disengaged from school the opportunity to complete their high school education. OYA views these students as 'At-Promise' as opposed to 'At-Risk' and aims to provide a premier high school dropout recovery program through relationship-focused, high-tech, and rigorous learning experiences.

Educator Preparation Programs

These programs offer credentialing and professional development to aspiring teachers and administrators looking to help lead the next generation of learners. With mentorship from experienced educators and field experts, participants gain skills to support diverse learners, collaborate with families, and create thriving classrooms in schools throughout Santa Clara County.

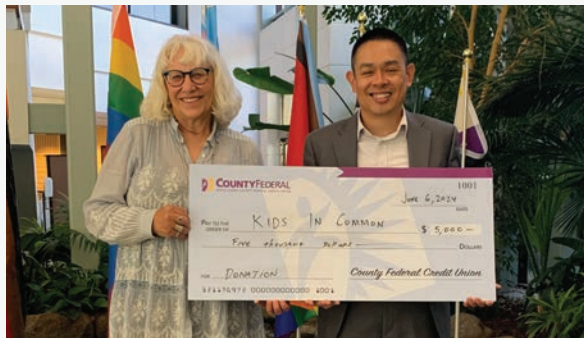
Celebrating the Educators Who Shape Our Future

29 Years of Supporting SCCOE's Teacher Recognition Celebration

For 29 years, Mirastar has proudly partnered with the Santa Clara County Office of Education to celebrate the exceptional educators who inspire, lead, and transform lives. In 2024, we recognized 36 outstanding teachers at the annual Teacher Recognition Celebration—an event that honors the heart and soul of our schools.

This year, Mirastar contributed \$14,000 toward the event and awarded \$6,000 in scholarships to six recipients of the Arts Leadership and Civics Leadership Awards—educators who spark creativity and foster civic engagement in their classrooms and beyond.

We also provided \$500 classroom grants to each of the 35 district-level Teachers of the Year, totaling \$17,500 in support of their continued impact.



Kids In Common

As Santa Clara County's only student-focused child advocacy program, Kids In Common received a \$5,000 grant to help students attending summer school get caught up on the credits they need to graduate.

The Richard Myles Johnson Foundation

The Richard Myles Johnson Foundation's Bite of Reality® program received a \$2,500 donation to support their program that uses real-world learning opportunities to equip teenagers with financial education around important life topics like car buying, home buying, and budgeting.



San Benito County Office of Education – Literacy Summit

The SBCOE Literacy Summit was awarded \$2,000 to support their Literacy Summit. This is a day filled with inspiring speakers, engaging workshops, and networking opportunities. Participants learn from experts, connect with fellow literacy enthusiasts, and gain insights to help promote literacy in the community. An awards ceremony recognizes outstanding students, educators, and/or schools that have made significant contributions to the field of literacy.



Rancho San Justo Middle School

Mirastar was honored to support Rancho San Justo Middle School with a \$2,000 donation toward a dedicated bench, a lasting tribute to a beloved educator whose impact extended far beyond the classroom. This teacher’s commitment to shaping young minds and uplifting the community left a profound mark, and we are proud to stand alongside students and staff in celebrating their legacy. This bench will serve as a meaningful space for reflection, connection, and inspiration—just as this educator inspired so many throughout the years.

Kneaded Culinary Academy at Rebekah Children’s Services

We supported the Kneaded Culinary Academy with a \$2,000 grant to help support their work in equipping disenfranchised youth with essential job skills, opening doors to careers in the hospitality industry. Through a 10-week program with 60 hours of hands-on instruction, students gain culinary expertise, workforce readiness, and the confidence to build a brighter future. Mirastar proudly contributed to this initiative, supporting their mission to empower young people through education and opportunity.



The Reading Factory

Rachel McCauley is the Reading Intervention Teacher at Ida Jew Academy & Valle Vista School. Ms. McCauley’s “Reading Factory” is dedicated to helping struggling readers and finding better ways of delivering instruction so that students are not slipping into the next grade level unable to read with fluency, understanding and joy. Mirastar was excited to provide a \$2,000 grant to the Reading Factory to support Rachel’s work.



Stipe Elementary School



At Stipe Elementary, young minds are introduced to STEAM learning through hands-on, experiential education, sparking curiosity and innovation from an early age. Mirastar 2024 Educational Scholarship Program:

Investing in Tomorrow's Leaders

At Mirastar, we believe that education opens doors and community service lights the way. That's why we are proud to support the next generation of changemakers through our Educational Scholarship Program—an annual tradition that celebrates academic achievement, civic engagement, and a commitment to building stronger, more vibrant communities.

In 2024, we received more than 50 applications from students attending high schools, universities, and technical trade schools across the region. These applicants represented the best and brightest of our youth—each one a testament to what's possible when passion meets purpose.

After a thorough evaluation process considering academic performance, school involvement, community service, and a powerful essay response, ten exceptional students were selected as this year's scholarship recipients and we awarded each with a \$2,000 scholarship, for a total of \$20,000.

Educational Scholarships

Meet Our 2024 Scholarship Recipients:

- **Lisa Fung**, attending **Stanford University**, co-founded Plática Conmigo – Chat with Me!, a cross-cultural student exchange program connecting youth in California, Mexico, and now Ecuador. Lisa is working to bring the initiative to Stanford's Spanish Immersion program, proving that language is a bridge—not a barrier.
- **Andrea Loera**, attending **San Diego State University**, is using her graphic design talents to champion mental health awareness. Her vision includes integrating awareness campaigns into college curricula and expanding collaboration between design and counseling departments.
- **Julia Martin**, attending **University of Portland**, served on the County's Getting to Zero (GTZ) Youth Advisory Board, using social media and outreach to reduce HIV stigma and improve youth access to public health resources. Julia believes this scalable model can be applied to other areas, like mental health and teen safety.
- **Isaiah Meza**, attending **San Jose City College**, draws from personal experience to advocate for incarcerated youth. Through insight into the juvenile justice system, Isaiah champions rehabilitation, education, and policy change to give young people a second chance.
- **Delilah Navarro**, attending **San Jose State University**, turned her family's immigration story into action. She authored a resolution advocating for migrant rights that was adopted by the Santa Clara County Democratic Party and continues to raise her voice for reform through pre-law studies and public speaking.
- **Tina Sinaki**, attending **West Valley College**, began collecting recyclables to buy toys for hospitalized children. Over the years, she transformed this grassroots effort into a community-wide, multi-benefit initiative, and now aspires to pursue psychology to further her impact.
- **Kevin Stovich**, attending **Loyola University in Chicago**, delivers breakfast to day laborers with his school's Latino Student Union. Inspired by the stories of undocumented workers, Kevin envisions a regional hub and volunteer network to ensure no laborer goes to work hungry.
- **Alyssa Chuor**, attending **San Diego State University**, is driven by a commitment to community support and equal opportunity for children facing economic hardship. Inspired by her involvement in community outreach and her own positive experience with speech therapy, she aspires to become a speech-language pathologist to empower individuals through improved communication skills.
- **Nicholas Kann**, attending **Purdue University (Indiana)**, served as a summer camp counselor at Walden West, where he built confidence in children through outdoor activities, igniting his passion for impactful education. This, combined with his computer science aptitude demonstrated by his machine learning project, has led him to pursue Software Engineering and Machine Intelligence at Purdue, aiming to innovate healthcare technology.
- **Paola Villasenor-Carrillo**, attending **San Jose City College**, actively fostered inclusivity at her high school by leading the Latinos Unidos club and supporting other cultural organizations. Now attending San Jose City College to study anthropology and Social Justice: Latinx/Chicanx studies, she aims to pursue a doctorate and contribute to the preservation of marginalized communities' histories through museum curation.

These students remind us that leadership comes in many forms—and that the heart of community impact lies in service, advocacy, and connection. As they begin the next chapter of their educational journeys, we are honored to stand behind them.
